

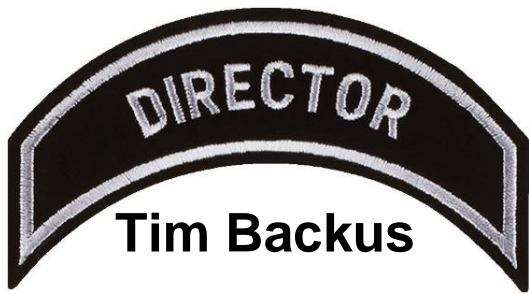

Memphis H.O.G. Chapter 4928 official ride planning guidelines

- #1** As **creator** of an official Memphis H.O.G. chapter 4928 ride with its ending destination, you must call and confirm that the restaurant or venue has accepted our members coming to their establishment with an approximate head count.
- #2** Create the route the members will take to the destination in one of the different route creators, for example the Harley Davison Ride Planner, with waypoints to control the route taken by members. Confirm a Road Captain that will be leading the ride. If no Road Captain is available, you, as the **creator** must take full responsibility, which entails keeping up with all the legal paperwork, like sign in sheets, and nonmember waiver forms, and carry accident reporting paperwork in case of an incident.
- #3** All forms will be available in the HOG drawer at the parts counter at Bumpus. If your ride leaves before Bumpus opens, either go to the dealership the day prior or reach out to Tim Backus (patkattim@yahoo.com), or Roelant Verbeek (verbeekr@yahoo.com) The following documents need to be filled out as needed:
1. Sign in sheets
 2. Nonmember waiver form
 3. Minor waiver forms (there are 2, 1 for the minor itself and for the parents of the minor)
 4. Accident reporting form
 5. All paperwork must be turned into Secretary Jim Tactac (jatactac1@comcast.net) for record keeping purposes
- #4** Submit ride plan with route via email to the following officers Tim Backus (patkattim@yahoo.com), Roelant Verbeek (verbeekr@yahoo.com), Dave Stockton (dmstockton@comcast.net) for approval.
- #5** Once approved contact Cathy Coats via email (cathycoats1955@gmail.com) or instant messenger. So she can create a post for the ride on membership websites, memphishog.com and Facebook, **48** hours prior to the time of the ride.
- #6** Road Captain or **creator** of the ride will be responsible for pre ride safety meeting. Complete a hand signal demonstration, announce who will be **sweeping**. Give a verbal route the ride will take to members, lead in the pledge allegiance, designate someone for prayer.
- #7** Road Captain or **creator** of the ride must make sure that participants are aware that the ride ends at its destination point. Road Captain or creator of the ride must ensure members know their way back to Bumpus Harley-Davidson or as close to it as possible

Here it is the long-awaited **scavenger hunt** list and rules for 2022.

- The contest goes through Thanksgiving 2022. That means your last opportunity for a picture is Thanksgiving weekend and all entries need to be submitted to me by that Sunday midnight.
- The winner will be announced at the HOG Christmas party. The winner will be the one with the most entries submitted. If there are multiple folks with the same number of entries, then we will randomly draw a name.
- You earn entries by snapping a picture of yourself and your motorcycle in front of the object and sending that picture to me at verbeekr@yahoo.com. Please add the following to the subject line *Memphis HOG Scavenger Hunt*. Make sure you add which category your entry should fall under.
 - In some cases it will not be possible to have your bike in the picture, no problem, just take a selfie and explain why the bike could not be in the picture.
 - In some cases it may be easier to do a group photo, like when you are on a ride with a group and it would take up too much time to take individual pictures. Have one person from the group submit the picture with a list of names that are in the group picture.
- You can have as many entries as you can for a particular object. For instance, you go on multiple trips where you can take a picture with a ferry, submit them all and you'll receive credit for all of them. However, it has to be a different ferry for each entry.
- You do not have to take pictures during HOG events, you can do this all on your own.
- Every entry is worth 1 point. You can get 5 points maximum in each item.
- All decisions on whether or not an entry is valid will be made by me and are final (no whining allowed).

MESSAGE FROM HOG SAFETY OFFICER **HOG Safety Article**

SAFE RIDING TIPS:

I. Traffic Strategies

- Don't Tailgate- Give yourself at least two seconds of space behind the vehicle in front in case you need to make an emergency get out from behind car.
- Keep bike in gear when stopped, not in neutral in case you need to make emergency get away.
- Head Checks- Don't rely on mirrors or peripheral vision. Do one before each lane change.
- Signal your intentions- Signal two full seconds before lane changes and four seconds for turns. Use hand signals and turn signals on bike.
- Avoid other driver's blind spots- Keep back, stay in their mirror view and accelerate when necessary.
- Cover the front brake lever in high-risk areas- Be ready for emergencies stops at intersections.
- Check your mirrors when you slow down-Look for escape route. The car behind you may not be alert.

II. Equipment Tips

- The right seat- What's comfortable in your living room is not what works best on the highway. You want back support and freedom of movement.
- Tire inspection- Dry rot, Cuts, and Foreign Objects.
- How's your tire pressure? Check before each ride.
- Tire replacement- When was it made? Is it over 7 years old? Tread depth is not only issue. Cupped Fronts, Squared off rears, uneven wear. All these equate to bad handling. Buy the best tires for your type of riding.
- Check bike fluid levels.

Since Roelant gave his motorcycle life history last month I will fill in rest of this page with mine.

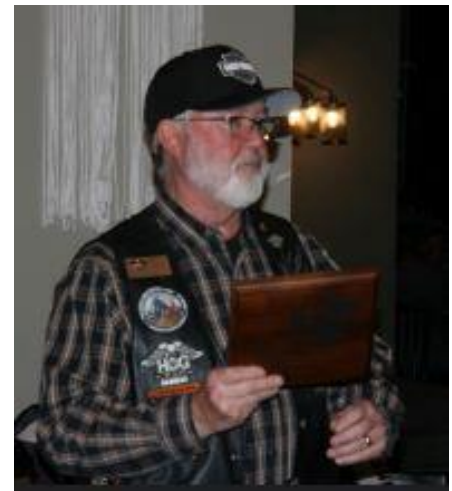
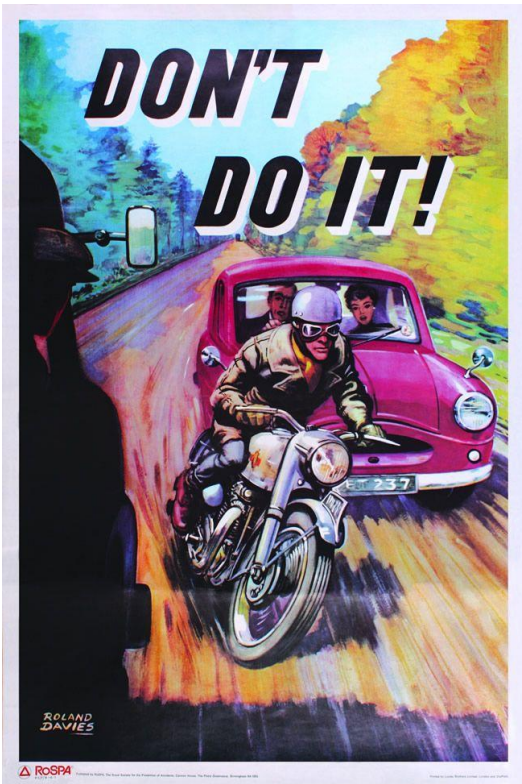
- Started riding at age 15 on Honda dirt bike.
- First street bike was Honda 350 when in college at age 20. And then 450 Honda 2 years later.
- Bought Kawasaki 1978 Z1R when I moved to Florida in 1978. Wife made me sell it when my first son was born in 1985. No riding on motorcycles again till 1997.
- Wife let me buy my neighbors 1997 Kawasaki Vulcan 800. Had friends in HOG club and rode with them a few times and decided I needed a Harley.
- January 1999 got lucky and bought my 1999 FXR2. (First CVO bike HD came out with.) Never plan to sell this one. Joined the HOG club that month.
- Went to Sturgis in August 1999. I have been back 6 times to Sturgis
- Wife said if she was going to ride with me to get an Ultra and I did in October 1999 and it had a side car. I put 91,000 miles on that bike.
- Sold that bike and bought my 2010 CVO Ultra which I still have and determined to put 100,000 miles on it before getting another. She has 84,000 on her now.
- I have ridden my Harley in all 48 lower states and have 200,000 miles since joining HOG club.

- Been to the last four Harley Davidson anniversary parties in Milwaukee. Every 5 years they have one. AWESOME Events. You must go to at least one. Next one 2023.
- I have the 1,000 and 1,500 Iron Butt Rides
- Been to Laconia, Daytona, Americade, Sturgis, Myrtle Beach and many other motorcycle rallies several times.
- Held every office position in HOG club except Secretary and Treasurer.

It has been a great ride so far meeting fabulous people on the road and seeing this GREAT country we live in. I plan to keep riding and experiencing great adventures till they put me in the assisted living home.

The Webmaster Desk



I have made additions to the Participation Page to stipulate the mileage award for Chapter Day Rides, Overnight Rides and In-State HOG Rallies. Any riding event or activity approved by the Head Road Captain is eligible for a mileage award typically on a round trip basis.

If you have been on the Memphis HOG Website very much at all you will have noticed that there is a redundancy of buttons that take you to the same page or link. I did that purposely to enhance the ease of navigation from page to page. I have placed links to the Events Calendar in two places. First in the center of the Home Page and secondly on the top ribbon of the Home Page. By using the link located in the top ribbon you can go straight to the Calendar regardless of which page you are in on the website.

There are a number of action buttons and links on the Memphis HOG Home Page. If you have fully explored the website, you may already be aware of them. In the center of the page the "National HOG" button will take you to the National HOG website. On the right side of the page, you will see the "Click above for 2022 H.O.G. Rallies". That link takes you to the National HOG Rallies website. The button "HOG Ride 365" takes you to the National HOG mileage website to see your official mileage that's been recorded by National HOG. If you are getting your bike serviced at Bumpus, the Service Department is recording your mileage for the National HOG Ride 365 program. If you are performing your own service work, you will need to work with the Bumpus Service Department to get your miles recorded. If you need mileage forms there is on a button called "Mileage Forms".

Various forms that our chapter uses are located on the Road Captains Page. These were checked and updated in January. There are also some of the same "release" forms located on the Safety Page. If you are a Road Captain for an upcoming ride, you should make sure you have copies of these release forms and sign-up sheets in your tour pack or saddlebag.

Photographer

As most of you know, we have a photo "slideshow" on the Participation Page. The slideshow are photographs of our chapter vests. If your vest is not showcased in our slideshow and you want yours included, let me know when you see me and I'll take a photograph of your vest for inclusion. As a side note, some of the current photographs are not clear and I'll be taking new photographs to clean it up. Also, if your vest has been updated since the last photograph taken, let me know and we'll get a new photograph in the slideshow. It is intended to be ever evolving.

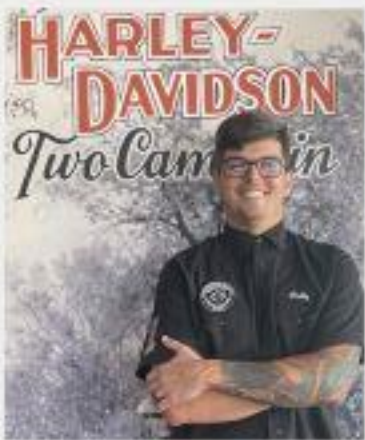

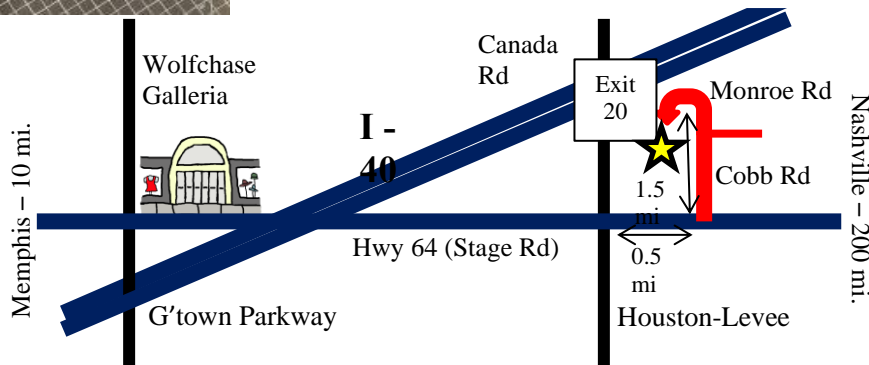
