

Safety Officer's Message

My old Boy Scout training had a motto we as motorcycle riders should put to use. It is "BE PREPARED"! It is easy for riders to get complacent, especially veteran riders, and not be prepared for the many events that can happen when riding a motorcycle. Do you still cover your brake and clutch levers when coming up on an intersection? Do you really know how to react when the car turns left in front of you at the intersection? Do you really know how your bike will react in a panic stop? If not I would advise you to take an experienced motorcycle-training course. You say you took one when you started riding five years ago. Well its time you took the advanced course. You need to take this course every so often to keep your skill sharp and to learn how your bike really handles. In this course you use your bike and you get to know exactly how fast it will stop. You will learn

how it will react in a quick left and right weave maneuver. You will do this in a controlled environment with experience teachers. This training might save your life. Bumpus HD is offering the ERC course for HOG Club members. State Tech also offers an ERC course. Don't put it off for spring is just around the corner. Contact me by email if you have an interest in taking a course

ONE RULE

That Will Keep You Alive On City Streets

Of all the things that we learn being out on the streets with our bikes, one stands out as the all time lifesaver in my book. If you can avoid it, never enter an intersection without another vehicle on your right side.

It should be noted that this advice assumes you ride in a country where people drive on the right side of the road.)

If you have to slow down in order to let a vehicle catch up with you on the right side, or if you have to increase speed a little so that you catch up with another vehicle, having one on your right side is as safe as it gets for entering an intersection.


Obviously this also means that if you are stopped at a traffic light and it turns green, you enter the intersection when the vehicle on your right does - no jackrabbit jumps if you want to live. Too tame?

Could be, but this rider likes it that way. In fact, I'd rather that the vehicle on my right was a bus or even an 18-wheeler.

By the way, it is safer that the vehicle be on your right than on the left. The closer you can be to the center of the intersection when you go thru it, the more air there is (on average) between you and somebody that comes at you from either side. This is just another way of saying that if you have to enter the intersection by yourself, do it in the left most lane.

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Road Captain's Gas Tank



Group riding has always been a part of our HOG Chapter. We strive to have well trained Road Captains to make your riding experience more enjoyable. Our ongoing training are just a couple of things we do to help make the rides safe.

Let's review some Group Riding information:

- Always arrive on time and with a full gas tank.
- ✓ We will always hold a riders briefing and review the route, rest and fuel stops, and hand signals before each club ride.
- ✓ Announce the lead, primary sweep and secondary sweep Road Captain's (please note that the secondary sweep may become a lead if a group gets separated due to a traffic light etc) for each group. If the group gets split don't panic. This is when the Secondary Sweep Road Captain will take the lead of the group; they will then work on regrouping with the front bikes in your group
- Ride in formation. The staggered riding formation (see diagram below) allows a proper space cushion between motorcycles so that each rider has enough time and space to maneuver and to react to hazards. The leader rides in the left third of the lane, while the next rider stays at least one second behind in the right third of the lane; the rest of the group follows the same pattern. A single-file formation is preferred on a curvy road, under conditions of poor visibility or poor road surfaces, entering/leaving highways, or other situations where an increased space cushion or maneuvering room is needed. We will never be side by side except for at stops. As you leave a stopped position the rider on the left will pull away first then the rider on the right and slowly stagger out to the proper formation.



If any rider has a medical or mechanical problem that they need to stop for try to find a safe spot to stop (but we know this may not be possible) and the sweep rider will stop with you. The Sweep Road Captain will assess the situation and help make a decision on what to do. The Lead Road Captain will take the main group on to a safe location and the Road Captains will talk via cell phone to see what needs to be done.

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


