


I know that not all of us can take time off from work to do this but if you can take the time to explore new roads and make some great memories!



### **Consumer Safety Alert:**

While motorcycle safety is always at the forefront in the mind of those that ride there are other

aspects of safety that touches our daily lives. In case you haven't heard, it was recently uncovered that an estimated 500 million Android

phones don't completely wipe data when the phone is factory reset. Data from applications like

Facebook, What'sApp, Contacts, Pictures, Text messages, E-mail and even your Google account info can be recovered after the device wipe is done.

So you may be thinking so what, or why does this matter? It matters because for many of us our phones are our "wallets" or our "brain dumps" so we don't have to remember numbers,

addresses, special dates, passwords, credit cards, and other key family info any longer. All of

this "critical data" is usually buried somewhere amongst the thousands of records stored on our

phones. Now just imagine your excited because it's time for your next device upgrade. You

wander into your providers retail store and pick out your next device that will store your life's history. The clerk behind the counter says to keep your personal info safe lets wipe your old device so your info is safe, right? Wrong, these smart phones and tablets are very complicated devices filled with on-board memory and external SD cards. This is where all of your personal

info, contacts, and pictures are stored. Therefore, if your device doesn't completely wipe you

might have well just handed your wallet to a complete stranger! So what can be done to prevent this wipe issue? So there are a couple of things you can do to

mitigate this issue. There is a encryption of data feature on most if not all Smart devices. On

Android you can typically find this option under Settings>Security>Encrypt phone. On Android versions since 3.0 and it must ALWAYS be enabled by the user. While this is a valuable feature

and should most always be used if you store "sensitive" personal data the downside is if you lose your device password then all of the data is unrecoverable. So I would suggest that if you

don't use encryption all of the time before you swap devices enable security encryption before

you do the factory reset! Once you enable the encryption and then do the reset all of your data

will be gone! Pay attention to any SD card encryption settings, You may have to manually select the SD card to encrypt it too.

You can also just remove the external SD memory card

from the old device and put it in the new device. However, if the SD card was encrypted in the

previous device the new device may not recognize it. Be sure to mention this to anyone helping

you with picking out a new device so they can offer the best approach to migrating the SD card

to your new device.

I said there were a couple options so the other option would be to walk out to the tool box and grab a hammer and go to town on the old device! It's a great stress relief to pound the daylights

out of a device that dominates much of our waking hours!
