WINTER CYCLE TIPS

In the south many of us ride our motorcycles all year long. However as the days get colder it takes its toll on the motorcycle performance and on our body's ability to perform as well.

- 1. Avoid black ice. This is just a name given to water frozen spots on the road, which occur when the temperature is below freezing. It's hard to see, but you need to anticipate it being on the road under freezing conditions. Bridges and shady parts of the road are most susceptible to these conditions. If you get on black ice don't brake or make sudden moves. Stay upright, pull in the clutch and coast your speed down to a manageable level.
- 2. Avoid frostbite and hypothermia. I covered this before so I won't go into details. Your nose, earlobes, fingers and toes are the first parts to get frostbite. Keep them covered. Riding at 30 MPH on a 45-degree day can put you in danger of frostbite. Keep copy of this chart in your bike for reference.



3 **Stay warm and well insulated.** Put on a base layer of moisture wicking thermal underwear. Dress in layers with leather or heavy nylon type motorcycle jacket and chaps. Use gauntlet style gloves for your hands to seal out wind. Ski pants and bibs work well for this purpose also. Clothes should be snug but not overly tight to restrict blood flow. Wear a full-face helmet or at least a ³/₄ style with a ski type mask

and even a face shield. A neck warmer or baklava on your head is a plus. Also use a windshield in winter to keep the wind off your chest.


- 4 If you really ride a lot in cold weather make an investment in electrical warming gear. You can't beat some of the electrical outdoor clothing they now make. They make jackets, vests, pants, socks and gloves. I personally wear the electric vest and socks. Many of these clothes are lithium battery powered and very light and no longer need to be attached to your bike battery. Motorcycles also come with heated grips and seats. With these items and dressed properly I have ridden in 20 degree weather and stayed warm. I find the electric vest keeps my core body temperature up enough that the warm blood flows out to my other body parts. Some people also use chemical heat in those packets you get at outdoor stores to keep hands and feet warm.
- 5 Experts also say to drink lots of liquids because you will get dehydrated faster in cold weather. Carry some water and sugary snacks on your bike. Try to stay away from caffeine and alcoholic drinks. However, drinks with sugar can give you carbohydrates, which help your body produce heat.
- 6 Motorcycle issues:
 - Your bike tires will be harder and have less grip in cold weather until they get warmed up. This will take longer.
 - Air cooled and carburetor equipped bikes take longer to warm up. Batteries will be less potent in cold weather and need to be charged up.
 - Bike cables will potentially not work as smoothly in cold weather due to lubricants being thicker. Spray with silicone in winter in joints and moving parts.
- 7 If you store your bike for the winter do the following:
 - a. Store your bike off the ground and/or pump up the tires to at least 45 lbs so the tires don't get flat spots sitting on a cold hard floor.
 - b. Fill your tank full of gas and use a fuel stabilizer to avoid gas turning to varnish and gumming up your fuel system. A full tank will also have less moisture develop due to changing temperatures.
 - c. Use a trickle charger for your battery to keep it charged up during the winter.

Merry Christmas to all!! Look forward to seeing you on the January 1 Ski Freeze Ride for the New Year.

These are just some of the places we've ridden to with new friends we have made since joining the club in 2018. Every year we go and see some amazing places.... sites we probably


