





MESSAGE FROM HOG SAFETY OFFICER HOG Safety Article April 2023

Well, spring is in the air and motorcycle riding time has started. The safety thought for this month is animal safety. Have you ever had a close encounter with a furry friend of nature on your motorcycle? Data shows that in a 12 month period about 1.9 million accidents nationwide occur between a vehicle and animals. Further data shows that Tennessee ranks 26 in the nation of having an accident with an animal. This means you have a 1 in 107 chance of hitting an animal in Tennessee. What kind of animals are you likely to encounter on the road? Deer are the most frequent and probably the most dangerous to a motorcyclist. Then there are bigger animals such as cows and horses that occasionally get out of fences. There are also smaller animals such as squirrels, dogs, cats etc. Since I have been riding I have had several close encounters with deer, dogs, and even a raccoon. You used to only see deer in the early morning and late afternoon. However, with the deer population increasing from 500,000 in 1980 to about 1.5 million today in Tennessee you will see deer at all hours of the day or night and in all types of weather. Fall is the most prevalent time for deer to be rushing across the road because the does get chased by Bucks wanting to have sex. But spring can also be a problem as newborn fawns are being born and the mother and the fawn can run across roads without looking because of predators after them. What safety tips do I have to offer? First be observant and diligent in scanning your surrounding as you go down the road. Don't get tunnel vision and just look at the bike ahead of you. If an animal is coming your way slow down and then brake hard as necessary. HONK the horn to get their attention. If you have a passenger on the back of the bike have them be on the lookout as well. We have had several members of the HOG club in the past have a collision with a deer while riding alone or even in a group. No one was seriously injured but the bike had lots of damage as a result of the collision. If a squirrel or small animal runs in front of you, not to worry, as they are mostly squishable and will not upset the bike if you hit them. So it is best not to brake hard for a squirrel.
