### ***Bragging Rights***

In 2008 your Memphis HOG Chapter re-introduced a competitive riding contest, *"The Memphis 500."* Since our last contest in 2002 our membership had changed and we were soon to find out how much our riding styles had changed as well. At the close of *"The Memphis 500"*, we had officially recorded 765,179 miles from the 60 members who participated. As I spoke with Benny Suggs, National HOG General Manager, HOG/Rider Services, a life member of Harley Owners Group, and a retired U.S. Navy Rear Admiral on Saturday, January 3, 2009, I was lamenting the fact that I knew our Memphis Chapter had ridden over a million miles in 2008. Benny, who had flown in from Milwaukee for the sole reason of presenting our Memphis Chapter with special accolades for our 2008 *Memphis 500 Contest*, smiled his best smile and said, "With all the riding passion this chapter has Memphis ought to make a go for it next year. Pull the chapter together and go for the million." The gauntlet had been thrown and the rest is now our chapter history.

I continued briefing Benny about the Memphis Chapter, our history, our members and our riding events. We shared our stats, our photo albums, and our scrapbooks. Benny began to see more and more that our Memphis Chapter could indeed attain the million mile goal. We were encouraged to step up and claim our 'bragging rights' as "the Million Mile Riding Chapter". Why not? If not us would we be reading about another chapter who had accepted the challenge? After all National HOG had just completed its inaugural Million Mile Monday on the last Monday in June 2008. Over one million HOG members worldwide had posted more than three million miles on HOG's first Million Mile Monday. If we could pull our members together for the 2009 riding year we would succeed. Miles are miles and a million miles is a million miles.

So how much is a million miles anyway? Forty trips around the equator would be about a million miles. Averaging 50 miles per hour, it would take you 1,666 days if you rode 12 hours a day. So in just over four and a half years you would have traveled a million miles. Well if we joined together and if we all rode our Harleys on short trips, long trips, iron butt trips, work trips, and pleasure trips then we could ride a million miles in one calendar year. If we held to the motto of Del Hofer, the dealer in Fargo, North Dakota, who coined the H.O.G. motto of "Ride and Have Fun", we could succeed and victory would be ours! Memphis Chapter, the Million Mile Riding Chapter, documented with actual miles ridden by our members- "Bragging Rights!" It sounded attainable.

*Well, "All good things are worth waiting for and working for. When obstacles are thrown in your path you must find a way to dissolve them, ride through them, ride around them, take a different route to avoid them but the ultimate focus and goal must be to just keep on keeping on and riding, and riding and riding some more."* This is what saved the Memphis Chapter in 2009. Obstacles, yes, we had a few. We pulled ourselves up by our riding boot straps and did what true Memphis HOGs do...we rode on. The economy tanked and we rode on. Chapter members were injured, some members passed away, and we rode on. Through every deal of the cards, through all our obstacles, through all our road blocks to success, we rode on. In what turned out to be a non riding year for many, the other members took the challenge and they rode on. As our chapter editor and graphic artist, Larry White proclaimed: *"Riders Needed. Shut Up and Ride!"*

The reason for being a member of the Harley Owners Group (HOG) is to ride our Harleys and have fun. WE were not designed to be a charity fund raiser. WE were not created

to be a social club (although socializing is an integral part of the experience). WE are not a dealer/member advocate. WE are a group of people who come together to experience riding in all of nature's beauty, in all kinds of weather, on all kinds of roads with all kinds of folks who show up to ride. We take away from each riding experience our own sense of peace and accomplishment. Riding offers each rider a challenge every time they throw their leg over the saddle. When the ride is complete and the Harley is parked, the common experience of the ride has bonded those particular riders together. They share a ride to return to with their own personal riding stories - meal after meal, and meeting after meeting. We ride to enjoy our freedom. We ride because we can. We ride because that is what riders do – we ride.

The only cost for membership in this riding clique, this riding group called Memphis H.O.G. is to get your Harley out of your garage, saddle up and take a ride with us. Your level of participation and volunteering is up to you. The more you show up and ride the greater your bond with the group. So I challenge you to step up and take the challenge which will provide you with a sense of satisfaction and accomplishment that cannot be purchased with any amount of silver or gold. Don't let 2010 pass you by. You will be the loser. You decide. Saddle up. The Memphis Chapter pledge is to continue to keep riding and having fun.

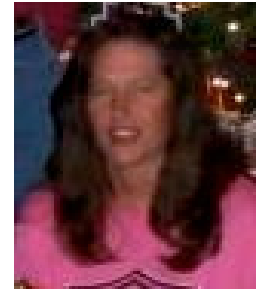

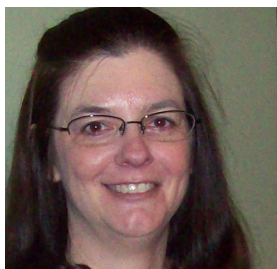

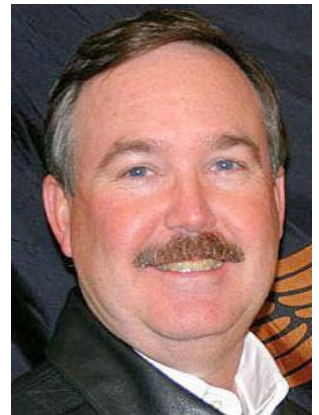

## ***Safety Officer***

I hope everyone made a new years resolution to keep the shiny side of their bike up. As your safety officer I plan to keep you informed about rider education classes, both novice an advanced, and to provide safety information in the monthly newsletter. I want to make mention of a website that I think all of you will find interesting. [www.msgroup.org](http://www.msgroup.org).

This site has numerous safety and riding tip articles that both beginners an advanced riders can learn from. Below is just a sample. I will publish one article monthly but there are too many to publish in one year so go to the site on your own.

**CONTROLLING YOUR LANE:** By-James Davis (Master Strategies Group).

Lane position should be chosen based, among other things, on establishing escape routes, making yourself visible to others, staying out of the blind spots of other vehicles, and road conditions. What is often overlooked, in my opinion, is the concept of 'controlling your lane'.

For example, assume you are riding on surface streets in a city and are stopped at a traffic light preparing to make a right turn. Logic suggests that you should be in the right track of your lane, but is it safer, I suggest, to be closer to the left track.

Why? Because if you are nearer to the left track of your lane you CONTROL the lane. There are people that upon seeing you in the right track with your right turn signal flashing will slide their vehicles into the lane beside you and try to share the lane - to get a jump off the line when the light changes.

The fact that you only have two wheels is of no consequence - you OWN the whole lane that they would try to share with you. If you were to change your mind and elect to not make that right turn, you would be in trouble. Worse, should that sharing vehicle actually decide to make a right turn too, you could easily be forgotten (in his blind spot) and he could drive right over you while making that turn.

Controlling your lane is as important as any other consideration when you choose your lane position.

**Keep the shiny side up and the rubber down.**
