

Happy New Year! I am excited about serving the chapter again this

year. It is wonderful being a part of such a fantastic group of people. We have a lot of fun activities planned for 2012. To show our appreciation for your support and participation we have developed an awards program. Below you will find the guidelines on how to earn the patches, pins, dangles, and rockers. The ride pin is a dangles program continuation from last year. If you were a member last year your ride points from 2011 will carry over to 2012.

2012 Participation Patch
The requirements for patches are
as follows:

You will be required to sign in on a regular sign in sheet. It protects our liability and serves as another checkpoint to awarding your patch.

In order to earn this patch you must earn 25 points during the year. You may earn your points by attending meetings, activities, socials, and rides.

All rides, socials, activities, and meetings are worth 1 point with the exception of overnight rides. These will be worth 2 points.

The only stipulations on "Meetings" are as follows:

Only Road Captains will receive a point for a RC Meeting.

Only LOH members will receive a point for a LOH Meeting.

Only Officers will receive a point for an Officer Meeting.

If you have any questions about your points please contact Pam Powell Secretary/Membership. All points are subject to verification by the Membership Officers and/or Secretary. In case of a dispute, the Director will have the final decision.

2012 Ride Pin/Dangle Program
The requirements for the pins and dangles are as follows:

The ride pin will be only for a rider and co-rider on their motorcycle (cages do not count). Only official Chapter Rides will count toward your number of rides. You must sign in for the ride to count.

You will receive your pin after completion of 20 rides.

After each 20 rides ridden, you will receive an attachment (dangle) to add to the Pin.

After 100 rides, the 5 attachments will change to a bar/rocker then you start over on adding an attachment (dangle) to the bar/rocker per every 20 rides.

It will take time to earn these but we have plenty of rides on the 2012 calendar. This does not replace the participation patch/rocker. This is to enhance the riding opportunities that the Chapter has to offer. The more you ride, the more points you score for your pin/dangle progression.

2012 Volunteer Program
The requirements for the rockers are as follows:

This year we would like to award our members for volunteering to help the chapter. The volunteer points will not go toward your participation patch this year, instead they will go toward your volunteer rocker.

For every 10 volunteer points you earn you will receive a volunteer rocker. These will fit under your participation patch.

You will get 1 point each time you volunteer. We will keep up with this on our sign in sheets.

There are many opportunities to earn your points. You can help with sign in sheets, sell tickets, donate to our monthly baskets, donate to drop your drawers, enter a chili or dessert in the Chili Cook-off Social, help set up at an event, enter a game at the HOG Waller, being the secret greeter, plan a ride or social with Head Road Captain/Activities approval, or write an article for the newsletter about one of your wonderful rides or a helpful tip.

If you have any questions about your points please contact Pam Powell Secretary/Membership. All points are subject to verification by the Membership Officers and/or Secretary. In case of a dispute the Director will have the final decision.

Chaplain Doorley

To start the New Year off on the right foot peg I thought I would write about balance. The dictionary has three good definitions for balance.

- 1. Balance is a state of equilibrium such as an equal distribution of weight.
- Balance is equality between the totals of the two sides of an account.
 Balance is a mental steadiness or emotional stability, a balance between work and life.

For balance definition # 1 we can look to the beginning when we first learned to ride a bicycle we had to develop a sense of balance, this balance was needed to keep gravity from having its way with us and pulling us to the ground. At first finding the balance point was difficult but later it became second nature. We now enjoy it so much we seek out long twisty roads just to test our skills as we conquer the pull of gravity while riding our Harley V twins.

We experienced balance # 2 soon after we spotted that new motorcycle we wanted. We had to determine if our check book balance was big enough to afford the new bike. Here the balance between income and outgo was hard to achieve but we learned the ways of financing and we moved on. Like with balance # 1 we needed to work on it but it isn't as much fun.

Balance definition # 3 on the surface may seem easy but it is most likely the hardest of all to achieve and it is an ongoing challenge for all of us. The first step to achieving balance is to recognize you are out of balance. If your bike tire is out of balance you can feel a wobble, uneasiness, or loss

of control in the ride, and all you have to do is to take it to the shop and have a technician put it back into balance. If your life is out of balance you may also feel uneasiness or loss of control but you can't simply pay someone to rebalance it for you, we have to do it ourselves.

Since this is the chaplain's column I'll offer a few things that may help bring more balance into your life. I'll leave balancing the force to Yoda. You may love your work and that's a good thing. It's been said if most people didn't like what they were doing civilization would come crashing down. However, there should come a time each day (or at least once a week) to say "Works over now, it's time for balance." Take time to stop and smell the roses or the fuel in the gas tank. Take time to reflect on chrome you have and not the chrome you want. Put some planned or unplanned miles on your Harley to unwind, reboot, or otherwise reconnect with the call of the highway, the thing that you loved about riding in the first place. Make some memories that aren't just about work. Finally here are two rules to live by:

- 1. God loves you and has a plan for you.
- 2. If you are out of balance re-read
