

MESSAGE FROM HOG SAFETY OFFICER HOG Safety Article March 2023

If you've taken a motorcycle safety course in the past, you'll know that swerving and stopping is a

common topic discussed throughout the course. There is a large debate on whether ABS (anti-lock braking system) should be on a motorcycle and questions surrounding what the system can do, and if it's worth the cost and weight associated with it. It's a highly debated topic across the motorcycle community, and we're here to dive in with our two cents on why you need ABS on your motorcycle.

WHAT IS ABS ON A MOTORCYCLE?


You may have heard the term ABS or anti-lock braking in reference to a motorcycle, but what does it actually do? Anti-lock brakes prevent the brakes from locking and skidding the tire. The ABS uses a small metallic ring gear attached to the hub of the motorcycle wheel in conjunction with a magnetic sensor to generate an electrical signal. The ring gear is often referred to as a tone ring or tone wheel, and the signal it helps produce is sent to the ABS unit. The unit measures the frequency of the signal (think of it like an off and on switch) and how it changes to know if the motorcycle is slowing down, speeding up, or keeping a steady speed.

HOW DOES ABS WORK?

It's easy to say that ABS make you stop faster or they make braking safer, but it's a bit more complicated than that. While the wheel sensor and tone ring send a signal to the ABS unit at a frequency, how the ABS unit reacts is where the magic happens. The signals are received by an intelligent module and it essentially counts the number of times the signal is sent by the ring and sensor on the wheel. How it knows the wheel is about to lock is the dramatic change in frequency of the signal pulses (a sudden decrease) and the number of pulses reaches almost to zero.

At that point, the intelligent ABS module slightly decreases the pressure to the brake system (primarily to the brake calipers) to allow the wheels to spin and then reapply the braking force. If it detects a locking situation again, it repeats the same action. The intelligent module reads the pulses up to 100 times per second and can adjust the braking system pressure 10 times per second. It reacts far faster than most people's' reflexes can. So trust in your ABS brakes, they can pump faster than you can. Stop safely my friends.



- 1. Event or Ride Lead is responsible for gathering sign-in sheets. For rides, most likely the Lead Road Captain for the ride but, you could see other officers or Road Captains taking responsibility.
- 2. The Event Lead or Road Captain reviews the sign-in sheet. This is where he or she verifies membership status or if a visitor has filled-out and signed a waiver.
- 3. The Event or Ride Lead forwards the Sign-In Sheets to the Chapter Secretary.
- 4. The Chapter Secretary updates the Participation Points and Miles which is maintained on an Excel Spreadsheet located in Dropbox. Dropbox.com is our repository for documentation for almost everything.
- 5. The Chapter Webmaster receives notification from Dropbox that documents have been updated.
- 6. The Webmaster edits the Participation spreadsheet, reformats the document for posting to the website and saves the finished file to a .pdf format.
- 7. Webmaster uploads the Participation Sheet .pdf to the website.
- 8. Chapter membership can now obtain the latest points and miles status on the Participation page on the Memphis HOG Website.

Be patient for points and miles posting. It usually takes several days for the above process to take place.

Do you give attention to the "Event Attendance" number on the "Participation" sheet? The average is 23 per event/ride. If we toss out the low attendance number in rides affected by the weather or a Road Captains meeting, The mean average is 31. The Memphis HOG Chapter is a good riding group.

Based on a couple of questions that have been asked of me, you may not know and for your information, the Events Calendar that Cathy Coats maintains for us is "Google Calendars". When you view it on the Website, it is actually a link to Google Calendars. Occasionally Google Calendars is down. In this situation there is no

viewing the calendar. You might think something is wrong with the Memphis HOG website but it's actually a problem at Google. Typical down time is not long.

Pursuit of Happiness

I just came back from my first chapter ride of the 2023 season, and it made me happy. While on the ride I enjoyed one of the greatest freedoms the founding fathers granted to us, the pursuit of happiness. We Harley riders don't pick a motorcycle for the gas milage we pick it because it has the ability to help us pursue happiness, to be free, to scratch the itch. There we were, a group of riders following a ribbon of highway on Harleys, riding as a group but individually pursuing happiness. While riding my mind wandered from the visual scene of a slightly barren late winter landscape to the sound of the V-twin powering my ride. As my custom I let my mind wander a little more and eventually thought of my carbon footprint.

I thought about how a gallon of gasoline weighs about 6 ½ pounds and after it passes through my well-tuned V-twin about 20 pounds of CO_2 are released into the atmosphere. But the release of CO_2 is not the bad thing some people want you to believe. You see, plants, especially this time of year when waking up from their dormancy, need CO_2 to grow, along with water and sunlight. During our ride the sun was shining, and the ground was wet, and we did our part by providing an extra bit of CO_2 to help the plants grow. I saw our ride as a way to distribute plant-life-necessary CO_2 along a country road. If a typical Harley gets 40 mpg, then that means 20 lbs. of CO_2 covers 40 miles or about ½ pound per mile. (That doesn't seem like much now does it?) With our internal combustion engine (ICE) powered vehicles we can travel where we like when we like. However, plants are stuck in one place, their roots can only collect moisture and nutrients where they are planted, they can't just pick up and move. So by traversing our beautiful country roads were doing our part to keep Tennessee the greenest state in the land of the free. (Remember the Davy Crockett theme song). Did you know when your lawn has fully greened up in the spring and summer 25 sq ft of sod can produce enough oxygen for 1 person for a day. And we couldn't last more than 5 minutes without oxygen.

So as long as your Harley is in tune every time you ride you are bringing life giving CO_2 to the plants around you, something an EV cannot do. During the summer months feeding the plants more CO_2 helps them use less water from the ground. In plant transpiration, plants breathe in CO_2 and breathe out oxygen and water through the small holes, stomata, in their leaves. The good thing is the more CO_2 that is available the shorter time the holes stay open and thus less water escapes. That bad freeze we had in the winter took its toll on many plants and they will need extra CO_2 to regrow the leaves they lost to the ice storm.

The takeaway is that riding your Harley in the pursuit of happiness is a good thing. Mankind was created to love God and love our neighbor as ourselves. And God wants us to enjoy all the beauty in this world He has blessed us with. Did you know that another definition for the word blessing is "to make happy". Just as much as God hates evil, God loves us. He has blessed us with the freedom to ride in this wonderful country of ours. So when riding or not, remember God loves you and wants you to be happy. Tell Him thank you and then take your Harley out and feed the plants.






