What's in a Road Name?



Whatever your nickname or road name is, it should be a reflection of who you are and what you portray or

stand for. A good nickname doesn't just sound cool, it tells a story. Nicknames are what other bikers know you by. Make it personal: Use a real name, use a profession, use hometown, use interests, use whatever makes it unique to the biker. Make it funny: Not a requirement, but a funny name is always a great conversation starter! I bet "Halfstep" would have a great story behind it. Make it easy to remember: This isn't a time to get formal and fancy. Keep your name short and simple so fellow bikers will remember it. Make it fierce: You're badass! You're feisty! You're a biker! If you're going to come up with your own name, make sure it resembles what a awesome person you are! But by all means don't make it as hard as some of the personalized license plates I spend 5 to 10 minutes trying to figure out what the hell it's saying. Make it sexy: Pick a name that shows your sultry side! Make it suit you: But most importantly, your road name should match your personality, appearance, character, skill sets, riding characteristics, or occupation. Don't pick a name just based on how it sounds, pick it because it suits you or the road name, you're attempting to give someone. Make it worth remembering. So for now I say goodnight, ride safe and may the sun always be at your back. Heinz out.

Memphis H.O.G. Chapter 4928 official ride planning guidelines

- #1 As **creator** of an official Memphis H.O.G. chapter 4928 ride with its ending destination, you must call and confirm that the restaurant or venue has accepted our members coming to their establishment with an approximate head count.
- #2 Create the route the members will take to the destination in one of the different route creators, for example the Harley Davison Ride Planner, with waypoints to control the route taken by members. Confirm a Road Captain that will be leading the ride. If no Road Captain is available, you, as the **creator** must take full responsibility, which entails keeping up with all the legal paperwork, like sign in sheets, and nonmember waiver forms, and carry accident reporting paperwork in case of an incident.
- #3 All forms will be available in the HOG drawer at the parts counter at Bumpus. If your ride leaves before Bumpus opens, either go to the dealership the day prior or reach out to Tim Backus (patkattim@yahoo.com), or Roelant Verbeek (verbeekr@yahoo.com) The following documents need to be filled out as needed:
 - 1. Sign in sheets
 - 2. Nonmember waiver form
 - 3. Minor waiver forms (there are 2, 1 for the minor itself and for the parents of the minor)
 - 4. Accident reporting form
 - 5. All paperwork must be turned into Secretary Jim Tactac (jatactac1@comcast.net) for record keeping purposes
- #4 Submit ride plan with route via email to the following officers Tim Backus (patkattim@yahoo.com), Roelant Verbeek (verbeekr@yahoo.com), Dave Stockton (dmstockton@comcast.net) for approval.
- #5 Once approved contact Cathy Coats via email (cathycoats1955@gmail.com) or instant messenger. So she can create a post for the ride on membership websites, memphishog.com and Facebook, 48 hours prior to the time of the ride.
- **#6** Road Captain or **creator** of the ride will be responsible for pre ride safety meeting. Complete a hand signal demonstration, announce who will be **sweeping.** Give a verbal route the ride will take to members, lead in the pledge allegiance, designate someone for prayer.
- **#7** Road Captain or **creator** of the ride must make sure that participants are aware that the ride ends at its destination point. Road Captain or creator of the ride must ensure members know their way back to Bumpus Harley-Davidson or as close to it as possible

My mind is still in that heel shifter mode and tells my leg that it needs to push something down. Well, if there is no heel shifter, then push the shifter under your toes down. Now instead of having shifted up, I am kicking myself a gear lower and am 2 gears below where I wanted to be. It has taken me some time to get used to that and hopefully I have kicked the habit.

Being a creature of habit is dangerous when riding on only 2 wheels. We have to be even more vigilant than when we drive our cars/trucks. On the other hand, being a creature of habit also helps us when we ride, because things become second nature and we don't have to pay attention to every motion that takes up a particular procedure, think about shifting. So, maybe being a creature of habit isn't all that bad after all.

- You can have as many entries as you can for a particular object. For instance, you go on multiple trips where you can take a picture with a ferry, submit them all and you'll receive credit for all of them. However, it has to be a different ferry for each entry.
- You do not have to take pictures during HOG events, you can do this all on your own.
- Every entry is worth 1 point. You can get 5 points maximum in each item.

• All decisions on whether or not an entry is valid will be made by me and are final (no whining allowed).

HOG Safety Article April 2022


I hope everyone is having fun on the various HOG rides and you are doing a good job at keeping safe on the open road. This month's article is about SCANNING while riding. We all know that as a motorcyclist we feel like we have a target on our backs. It seems like cars, trucks, dogs, pedestrians etc. are aiming for us. In today's modern times the cell phone and touch screen panels in cars and trucks add to the danger we face on the road. As a two wheeler we also have to be very aware of road conditions all the time. Items such as gravel, wet roads, oil, potholes, speed bumps and railroad tracks are dangerous to us when they would not be a second thought in a car.


As riders we can't get complacent on our bikes. You have to scan your mirrors, instrument panel, stuff ahead, stuff behind, and stuff on the sides all while you are riding. Proper scanning techniques can help you stay out of trouble. The secret is to not dwell at one area for a long time. Train your eyes to move around systematically in all directions. It understandable you will spend most of your time looking straight ahead with less time looking behind. How long is your complete scan cycle? Is it 8 seconds, 10 seconds etc.? How do you divide it up among looking forward, in mirrors to the sides and rear, at the instrument panel. When you are in traffic you will speed up the scanning process and on the long road you can slow it down. However, learning to scan effectively will make you a safer and better rider on the streets. I hope these thoughts help.






